

Studio 1 Phineas Rose Wood Joinery

1112 Graves Mill Road, Madison (540) 948-4248.

In **Richard & Ninika Gordon's** timber frame workshop/showroom they hand-make fine furniture using traditional joinery. **Jo Perez** uses stained glass to create an experience in light and color. **Sharon Zarambo** makes hand-painted pillows incorporated with found objects in boxes, whimsical and cheerful. **Directions:** 29N to Rt. 230W 4 miles, to Wolfstown. Turn right on Graves Mill Rd. (Rt. 662). 1 mile on right. See sign for Phineas Rose Wood Joinery. From Stanardsville, take 230E 7 miles, to Wolfstown. Turn left onto Rt. 662.

Studio 2 Noon Whistle Pottery

328 Main Street, Stanardsville (434) 985-6500.

A 1940's filling station is the home to **John Pluta**, who builds high-quality acoustic instruments from the finest red spruce, mahogany, maple and ebony. **Directions:** From Ruckersville go west 10 miles on Rt. 33. At traffic light for Stanardsville, take Bus. Rt. 33 into town. Studio on left.

Studio 3 Jaeger & Ernst

4785 Burnley Station Lane, Barboursville (434) 973-7018.

At the renovated train depot in Burnley Station, owners **Walter Jaeger & Craig Ernst** will exhibit their custom design/build furniture and cabinets. **Terry Porter**, Crickhollow Pottery, will show her wheel-thrown and carved functional, high-fired stoneware pottery. **Anita Whitney's** jewelry features wire-wrapped and soldered pieces in platinum, 18K gold and argentine silver, including gemstones. **Directions:** From Rt. 29N go east on Burnley Station Rd. (Rt. 641). In 4.5 mi., studio is on right. From Rt. 250E take right on 20N, go 6 miles, left onto Burnley Station Rd. (Rt. 641), go 2.5 miles. Studio on left after crossing the RR tracks.

Studio 4 Mud Dauber Pottery

4225 Earlysville Road, Earlysville (434) 973-7943.

In the renovated warehouse of the 1890's Earlysville General Store, studio owner **Suzanne Crane's** wheel-thrown stoneware vessels, sinks, tiles and tile tables will be on display. **Laurie Duxbury** combines timeless weaving techniques and contemporary colors to produce elegant textiles. Resident potter **Becky Garrity** will show her fine functional stoneware, celebrated for its Asian look and everyday use. **Directions:** From C-ville, take Rt. 29N to Airport Rd. Turn left on Airport Rd. to roundabout. Take Dickerson Rd. (Rt. 606S) from roundabout toward Earlysville Rd. At next roundabout go right onto Earlysville Rd. (Rt. 743). We are 0.4 mile past It's ALL Good groceries on your right.

Studio 5 Blaise Gaston, Inc.

686 Fairhope Avenue, Earlysville (434) 973-1801.

In his owner-built studio, **Blaise Gaston** will exhibit his contemporary furniture designs combining grace and practicality. **Nancy Ross** will display both wheel-thrown and altered functional and sculptural pottery. **Directions:** From Rt. 29N turn left on Airport Rd. to roundabout. Take Dickerson Rd. (Rt. 606S) from roundabout toward Earlysville Rd. At next roundabout go right onto Earlysville Rd. (Rt. 743). Go 1.8 miles, turn left on Reas Ford Rd. Go 2.8 miles, turn right on Bleak House Rd. Go 0.5 mile, turn left on Fairhope Ave.

Studio 6 Frederick Williamson Bowls

5623 Sugar Ridge Road, Crozet (434) 823-1882.

Fred Williamson will display fine greenwood turned bowls, both functional and artistic. **Directions:** From C-ville, 12.5 miles west on Barracks Road (Rt. 614) to White Hall. At the Piedmont Store, go straight ahead passing the LEFT side of the store onto Sugar Hollow Rd. Still Rt. 614. Go 2.2 miles, right on Sugar Ridge Rd., 0.3 miles. Right at blue mailbox with red cardinal, Box 5623. From Crozet, take Rt. 810N 5 miles to White Hall. Turn left onto 614, etc.

Studio 7 The Barn Swallow

796 Gillums Ridge Road (Rt. 682), Ivy (434) 979-4884.

Janice Arone's stoneware is a mixture of functional objects as well as sculptural pieces. They range from dinnerware to fountains, sinks, and contemporary lighting. **Mary Ann Burk** offers her own interpretation of nature combining the elements of texture, color and pattern in sculptural and altered, functional porcelain. **Enid Adams** will show her nature prints on silk as wearable and wall art. Textile artist **Lotta Helleberg** will show leaf-printed objects, such as wall hangings, pillows and table linens. **Directions:** From Charlottesville, take 250W, go 2.5 miles past the town of Ivy, turn left onto Rt. 682, Gillum's Ridge Road, and park.

Studio 8 Michael Keith Restoration

1304 E. Market Street, Suite E, Charlottesville (434) 979-7086.

Creating furniture inspired by classic lines, **Michael Keith** also specializes in high-end restorations of period antiques. **Elizabeth Krome** will exhibit her functional and decorative stoneware and porcelain. **Directions:** From Rt. 250E turn right on High St. Then left on Meade Ave. At first traffic light, turn left on East Market St. Take immediate right into parking area. Studio at front of building. Additional parking in rear of building.

Studio 9 Jeff Barratt Woodworking

1304 E. Market Street, Suite K, Charlottesville (434) 409-4820.

Jeff Barratt uses local woods to build furniture and cabinetry in both traditional and contemporary styles. **Directions:** See directions for Studio 8. At back of building.

Studio 10 taviametel and Martha Keith

1304 E. Market Street, Suite V, Charlottesville (434) 466-4042.

In this shared jewelry studio, **Martha Keith** and **Tavia Brown** work independently creating one-of-a-kind and custom wearable pieces in various metals and materials. **Directions:** See directions for Studio 8. Front left corner of building.

Studio 11 A. Korotky Studio

2331 Highland Avenue, Charlottesville (434) 295-5057.

Andrea Korotky weaves one-of-a-kind, original textiles using traditional methods on an 8-harness loom. Display and demonstration.

Jan Crowther creates mostly functional wheel-thrown and hand-built pottery. **Lindsey Mears** will show her artist's books, recycled blank books, and her book conservation work. **Directions:** From Rt. 250 turn onto McIntire Rd., go approx. 1.5 miles, turn right onto Cherry Ave., go 1.5 miles, turn right onto Highland Ave. 6th house on left.

Studio 12 Mary Beth Bellah

1855 Arrowhead Valley Road, Charlottesville (434) 245-9108.

Mary Beth Bellah takes quilting into 3-dimensional space combining traditional and non-traditional elements. Goldsmith **George Bentley**, specializing in hand engraving, will demonstrate this fine craft on a portable workbench. **Yates Spencer's** work is a search for beauty and humor using contemporary and original blacksmithing ideas and techniques. **Directions:** From C-ville take Rt. 29S toward Lynchburg. 3.25 miles after the I-64 interchange, turn left on Rt. 745 (Arrowhead Valley Rd.) Go 1 mile, studio is on left. Take gravel drive to the house, park in grass along drive for easy turn-around.

Studio 13 Buck Creek Pottery

1781 Buck Creek Lane, Faber (434) 263-4192.

Owner **Trew Bennett** produces teaware for Chanoyu, gardenware and tableware for specialty cuisine. **Directions:** From C-ville, take Rt. 29S for about 20 miles. 3 miles after crossing the Nelson County line, turn right on Rt. 617 (Buck Creek Lane). Follow sign to parking area.

Studio 14 Nan Rothwell Studio

221 Pottery Lane, Faber (434) 263-4023.

Nan Rothwell makes functional pottery that she fires in salt glaze, stoneware and wood. **Directions:** From C-ville, from I-64 take Rt. 29S about 25 mi. Turn right on Rt. 6W. After 1.75 mi. take the first left, Rt. 634 (Adial Rd.). After 0.8 mile, take the next left, Rt. 613 (Rocky Rd.). After 0.5 mile, take the next left, Pottery Lane. Bear left at the fork.

Studio 15 Spruce Creek Gallery

1368 Rockfish Valley Hwy (Rt. 151), Nellysford (434) 361-1859.

Spruce Creek Gallery displays a unique mix of pottery, woodworking, jewelry, furniture, paintings and sculpture with a focus on local artists. **Maggie Stultz** will show her functional pottery featuring colorful and whimsical patterns. **Directions:** From C-ville, I-64W to Crozet exit 107. Take Rt. 250W to base of Afton Mountain. Left onto Rt. 151S (follow signs to Wintergreen Resort). Gallery on left, 1 mile beyond Nellysford.

Studio 16 Wayfarer Forge

3261 Afton Mountain Road, Afton (434) 465-5993.

Gerald Boggs hand-forges iron into objects of form and function. **Directions:** From C-ville, take exit 107, turn left on Rt. 250. As you near the top of the pass, Rt. 6 will appear; take it, and Wayfarer Forge is 0.5 mile on the right.

Studio 17 SoLace

193 W. Spotswood Avenue, Elkton (540) 298-5222.

Barbara Polin will show one-of-a-kind marbled silk clothing and silk and leather accessories for both men and women. **Directions:** From Stanardsville go 14 miles on Rt. 33W to Rt. 340 north exit in Elkton. At 2nd light, turn left onto Spotswood Ave. Go four blocks. Studio on left with purple awnings just before light.
